Preparing to Complete Your Pastoral Plan Template

Congratulations! You're about to draft your pastoral plan. We know you've worked hard to get to this point, and there is more work to do. But you're not doing this work alone. We are supporting you and have provided tools to help you put together a pastoral plan that will help your parish become a community built for mission! To assist you...

- 1) We're praying for you!
- 2) We've provided you a Pastoral Planning Template.

To get the most out of this template, we offer the following steps to help prepare you and your team to put together a great pastoral plan for your parish community.

Format

We suggest a 1 day and ½ format for your planning day; for example a Friday evening and a full day Saturday. The pastoral planning template is broken down into five sessions that are best done in a timely manner, in succession, as they build upon each other to form your pastoral plan.

The pastor and the whole pastoral planning team are to be involved in these sessions. Your faith community has contributed their voice to the process through the information reflected in your Ministry Assessment Reports (MARs) and Discernment Surveys. (DS)

Each session should run roughly an hour to an hour and a half.

Session Facilitation Video - 5 to 10 mins
Short introductory videos produced by the Office of Pastoral Life and New Evangelization that help set
the tone for the session.
Reflection & Prayer Time (individual & communal) – 20 mins
A time for grounding yourselves in prayer and the context of your parish reality.
Activity – 30 -45 mins
This activity is the "work" of the session; it will become content for your pastoral plan.

Material

The workbook is broken down into five sessions. Each session prepares you for the session that follows. To complete each session well and be as fruitful as possible there are steps that need to be completed by the whole pastoral planning team to prepare for the planning day. Distribute a copy of the workbook to each member of the planning team to be reviewed prior to the planning day.

To facilitate the day, Companion Videos have been produced for each session and are to be viewed on the planning day. To do so you will need to have internet access on-site during your planning day or download the videos prior to meeting.
